2023 CITY ELECTIONS

The City of Harlem will be conducting a General Election Tuesday, November 7, 2023 to fill two seats for Councilmembers. Qualifying will start at 8:30 a.m. Monday, August 21, 2023 and end on Wednesday, August 23, 2023 at 4:30 p.m. The Qualifying Fee for the Office of Councilmember is \$108.00. A qualifying packet may be picked up at City Hall. No person shall be eligible to serve as Councilmember unless that person is at least 21 years of age and shall have been a resident within the city limits of Harlem for 12 months prior to the date of the election and shall continue to reside therein during their term and must be registered and qualified to vote in municipal elections for the City of Harlem, Georgia.

The following is a listing of important information and dates in regard to this election:

Early/Advance/Saturday Voting - Will be conducted at the former Euchee Creek Library located at 5907 Euchee Creek Drive, Grovetown. Early/Advance Voting will be available beginning Tuesday, October 16, 2023 thru November 3, 2023; M-F from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday voting will be on October 21, 2023 and October 28, 2023 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Absentee Ballots by Mail - Absentee Applications will be accepted August 21, 2023 through October 27, 2023; an application must be submitted to receive a ballot by mail. Absentee ballots will be mailed out October 16 - October 27, 2023. Send a written request to the Columbia County Board of Elections, P.O. Box 919, Evans, GA 30809 to receive a ballot by mail. Please contact them at 706-868-3355 if you have any questions. Absentee ballots must be received prior to the close of the polls (7:00 p.m.) in the office of the Board of Elections on the day of the election, Newment 7, 2023, and a set of the polls (7:00 p.m.) in the office of the Board of Elections.

November 7, 2023, in order to be counted.

Voter Registration Deadline - October 10, 2023 is the registration deadline to be eligible to vote in the November 7, 2023 General Election.

Eligibility to Vote - To be eligible to vote in this election, you must be a resident within the city limits of Harlem and be registered to vote within the city limits of Harlem. If you need to verify your voter registration or polling place, please visit <u>https://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov</u>. If you are new to Harlem, please make sure to update your registration to reflect changes in your address. You can complete a change of address, register to vote (using your Georgia driver's license/state ID), view sample ballots, access absentee application forms, and print your precinct card thru this same website. Updates should be completed by October 10th.

There are three polling places/precincts for the City of Harlem: the Columbia County Library Harlem Branch, the Harlem Senior Center and 2nd Mt. Moriah Church. On Election Day, November 7, 2023, they shall be opened from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and voters must go to their assigned precinct.

FENCES:

The city is seeing an increase in fence installations. These are very helpful for containing pets, improving privacy, and increasing security. We would like to remind everyone that the city has a Fence Review Permit. There is no fee, but review before construction is required because:

- 1. If you are replacing an existing fence, the existing fence may be on your neighbor's property.
- 2. There may be utilities where you are planning to place your fence that you need to know about.
- 3. A fence over seven feet tall does require a building permit.
- 4. Stormwater easements may mean you need to install gates to keep the easement open.

The worst case encountered by the city was someone building over a stormwater easement. They had to move almost 200-feet of fence. The very worse case scenario is the need to access the easement and the fence being removed by chain saw. Being an encroachment, there would not be any reimbursement.
