FROM THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT:

BUILDING PERMITS ARE REQUIRED IN HARLEM:

The City of Harlem is required by state law to issue building permits, to conduct inspections of construction, and to certify that inspections have taken place. The City also has enacted ordinances guiding where construction can take place. The City is asking our residents to contact the City before construction projects to check where construction can take place and if a building permit is needed.

Examples are:

- 1. Building an addition to your house.
- 2. Converting a closet to a bathroom which requires
 - new water and sewer lines.
- 3. Running new electrical wiring to your attic to help use the attic for storage.
- 4. Having a new permanent air conditioning unit installed.

The City is always available to talk about a proposed project. Talking beforehand can prevent work stoppages and penalties down the road. Building permits help protect the safety of property owners, fire fighters, and emergency responders. Please call (706) 556-0043 with any questions.
