LAND DISTURBANCE ON PRIVATE PROPERTY:

There are a lot of federal and state laws that apply to building construction and yard projects. If you are planning to dig or disturb land on your property, please contact city hall to check to see if you'll need a permit to do so. In most cases, you will not need a permit, but it is better to be safe than sorry!

DIRT:

Harlem is growing and is also a wonderful place to live. Homeowners have backyard projects that result in a pile of dirt. What to do with it?

The State of Georgia has extraordinarily strong erosion and sedimentation control regulations. Just letting that pile of dirt sit in the back yard can impact your neighbor. Or worse, it is placed on nearby 'vacant' properties. Both could legally be considered trespassing.

To deal with a project that will leave you with a pile of dirt:

- 1. Call the city to ask about your specific situation.
- 2. Determine if the project will result in impacts upon your neighbors.
- 3. Determine the best method to remove extra dirt.

The city is available to discuss projects that involve moving dirt. The city has been contacted by residents that have muddy water coming onto their land. This ends up being a civil court case. City personnel are always available to talk about a project.
