HISTORIC DISTRICTS:

Over 20 years ago, the city established three historic districts and the Harlem Historic Preservation Commission. This was done to protect the unique look and feel of Harlem- which is what gives us our hometown feel. The city has over two hundred historic structures and some have special development and construction regulations. Before buying or working on an older home:

- 1. Check to see if the building/home is a historic structure.
- 2. Check to see if the building/structure is in a historic district.
- 3. If it is in a historic district, there will be special regulations to help keep the look and feel of the building/structure.
- 4. Almost all improvement projects can be done within the historic preservation guidelines.

Harlem has the most concentrated number of historic homes in Columbia County. By working together, we can keep Harlem Harlem. Please contact the city with questions you may have because once historic features are lost, they seldom can be regained.
