2019 GENERAL ELECTION QUALIFYING

The City of Harlem will hold a General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2019 for the purpose of electing two Councilmembers for a four year term. Candidates in this election will take office on January 1, 2020.

The Qualifying dates will be Monday, August 19 through Wednesday, August 21 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at City Hall, located at 320 N. Louisville Street. The qualifying fee shall be \$108.00.

No person shall be eligible to serve as Councilmember unless that person is at least 21 years of age and shall have been a resident within the city limits of Harlem for twelve months prior to the date of the election and shall continue to reside therein during their term and must be registered and qualified to vote in municipal elections for the city of Harlem, Georgia.
