On your behalf, the City of Harlem is consistently hiring quality professionals to help mitigate the current and anticipated growth in the area. Code compliance personnel are diligently focusing on and improving community appearance by working with citizens and property owners to improve and maintain property aesthetics and value. This is attained through enforcement of building and property maintenance codes. It is important for a community to appear clean, well kept, and generally clear of public nuisances, eyesores, and unhealthy conditions. The appearance of a community weighs heavily in the decisions of prospective residents and businesses in locating to a particular area. A clean, safe, and well kept community can stabilize or increase property values, provide a healthy environment, and make citizens proud of the area in which they live. Accordingly, a community needs a set of regulations to keep the area clean, remove unsightly conditions, and prevent unhealthy and unsafe situations from occurring. The purpose and intent is to encourage a clean, healthy, and satisfying environment; one free of nuisances, eyesores, and unhealthy, unsafe, or devaluating conditions. Storing, collecting, or scattering any garbage, junk, trash, refuse, abandoned property, or abandoned (non-operating) vehicles that are unsightly, unhealthy or hazardous are prohibited. This includes (but is not limited to) unsheltered storage of pipe, lumber, wire, brick, discarded appliances, machinery, furniture, piles of dirt, gravel or other like substances, or any unsanitary items attracting flies, insects, rodents, vermin, or other animals. Please review the City of Harlem Code of Ordinances, located on our website, to know and understand what constitutes a nuisance and can or cannot be stored on your property.
