CITY ELECTIONS

The City of Harlem will be conducting an election Tuesday, November 5, 2019 for two Council seats. The following is a listing of important dates and information in regards to this election:

October 14 - November 1: Early/Advance Voting - Building G3 (former Rhodes Murphy Building next to Zaxby's) at the Government Complex Center on Ronald Reagan Drive in Evans. Early/Advance Voting will be available Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There will be NO Saturday voting.

October 14 - November 1: Absentee Voting by Mail - Send a written request to the Columbia County Board of Elections, P.O. Box 919, Evans, GA 30809 to receive a ballot by mail. Please contact them at 706 868-3355 if you have any questions.

October 7: Voter Registration deadline to be eligible to vote in the November 5, 2019 General Election.

To be eligible to vote in this election, you must be a resident within the city limits of Harlem and also be registered to vote within the city limits of Harlem. If you need to verify your voter registration or polling place, please visit https://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. If you are new to Harlem, please make sure to update your registration to reflect changes in your address. You can complete a change of address, register to vote (using your Georgia driver's license/state ID), view sample ballots, access absentee application forms, and print your precinct card thru this same website.

There are three polling places for the City of Harlem. They are: Columbia County Library Harlem Branch, the Harlem Senior Center and 2nd Mt. Moriah Church. Letters were sent to the residents that live within the city limits of any changes made to their polling place. The addition of the new polling places was due to the growth within the city limits of Harlem as well as the surrounding unincorporated area.
