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6 **TO ADOPT THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 MILLAGE RATE AND TO LEVY TAXES PURSUANT**
7 **TO SECTION 6.27 OF THE CITY CHARTER OF THE CITY OF HARLEM, GEORGIA TO**
8 **RAISE THE AMOUNTS REQUIRED BY THE BUDGET FOR EACH FUND OF THE CITY OF**
9 **HARLEM, GEORGIA**

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11 **WHEREAS**, sound governmental operations require a levy of taxes and establishing of a millage rate in
12 order to plan the financing of service for the residents of the City of Harlem; and

13
14 **WHEREAS**, the City Manager, per Section 6.25 of the City Charter of the City of Harlem, has prepared
15 and submitted to the Mayor and City Council a budget for the year beginning January 1, 2024 and ending
16 December 31, 2024; and

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18 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council have adopted as required by Section 6.26 of the City Charter of
19 the City of Harlem a balanced budget for the City; and

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21 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Harlem have advertised and conducted appropriate
22 public hearings for the proposed FY 2024 millage rate adoption as required by Georgia Law.

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24 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT**, the Mayor and City Council hereby approve the
25 proposed 2024 millage rate of 9.35 mills. This rate applies to all personal and real property for which a
26 value is determined, a tax assessed, and the same collected by the local government. The rate shall apply
27 for the 2024 fiscal year. The revenue shall be used by the City as determined by the Mayor and Council
28 and per Georgia law and the Charter. The Mayor and City Manager are hereby directed to execute all
29 necessary documents and take all actions necessary to operate within said millage rate.

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31 In addition, the City hereby reauthorizes a special assessment of \$45.00 for Fiscal Year 2024 for the
32 maintenance of decorative streetlights in the following subdivisions as authorized by the City Charter:
33 Ansley Place, Phillips Crossing I, Phillips Crossing II, West Forrest I, West Forrest II, Hardy Station I,
34 Hardy Station II, Cornerstone I, Cornerstone II, Cornerstone III and Cornerstone IV.

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36 All resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with this resolution are repealed. This resolution is
37 deemed to be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this resolution shall for
38 any reason be determined invalid, such determination shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of
39 this resolution. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage.
